Corner of Saul's Robe

1 Samuel 24:1-22

Major Segments:

- Saul is chasing David intent on killing David in order that Saul's son Jonathan can be Israel's next king
- God keeps Saul from finding David near the "Rock of Escape"
- Saul then is delivered into David's hands and David has the opportunity to kill Saul
- David spares Saul then confronts him and Saul realizes David's righteousness and loyalty

Segment Questions:

- In the beginning of the story Saul is very close to capturing David. What happens to keep Saul from completing his mission? Is this coincidence or providence?
- Later Saul returns to search for David and complete his mission against David. What happens when Saul stops briefly to relieve himself in the cave? How do David's men react to David's apparent lack of courage? How does David feel about cutting the corner of Saul's robe off? What is David's response to his men?
- David confronts Saul. How does he address Saul? Does David's tone indicate how he feels about Saul? How does Saul react to David's talk? What does Saul ask of David?

Action Questions:

- Would David have been justified in killing Saul once Saul was delivered into his hands in the cave?
 After all, David knew of God's promise to make him king. How do we apply this principle of waiting on God to act in our own lives?
- David knew that he was the chosen one to succeed Saul but he allows God to be the one to remove Saul and anoint David. To whom is David loyal, Saul or God?
- How can we know we are in God's will, allowing Him to act as He will without taking control and being God's agent of change?

Saul started chasing David from place to place. At one point, they came to a large rock formation. David and his men were on one side, and Saul's army was on the other. If Saul had gone a little farther, he would've seen David and been able to get him.

Just then a messenger went to Saul and said, "Hurry! You need to come back. The Philistines have invaded our land!" So Saul had to retreat in order to save the nation from the Philistines. After that, that rock formation was called "Rock of Escape."

David moved his men to the canyons of En-gedi. After Saul was done fighting the Philistines, he heard that David was at En-gedi. He selected 3,000 of his best soldiers and took them toward Engedi.

"Now I know it's true. You'll be king over Israel. Oh David my son, swear to me by the Lord. When you're king, don't kill my descendants. Don't eliminate my father's name from our tribe." So David made that yow to Saul.

The king then took his men and returned back home. David went back into hiding. About that same time, the prophet Samuel died, and everyone in Israel mourned his death.
