Joshua sent two spies into the land of Canaan. He told them, “Go and watch the people, especially those in the city of Jericho.”

The spies went into Jericho and stayed at the house of a prostitute named Rahab. The king of Jericho heard about this, so he sent a message to Rahab saying, “Bring out the spies who are in your house.”

She hid the men on her roof and then told the king, “Yes, those men were here, but they left the city before gate was closed for the night. You can catch them if you go quickly.” So the king sent men to chase after the spies.

Rahab went to the men and said, “Our people are afraid of you because we heard of the great things God has done for you. He’s the Lord of heaven and earth. I’ve protected you. Therefore, show kindness to my family and spare our lives!”
