Rebecca - A Wife for Isaac

Genesis 24: 1-67

Segment:

- Abraham gives orders to his servant to find a wife for Isaac
- The servant, with God's help, finds Rebecca
- Rebecca leaves her family and marries Isaac

Segment Questions:

- Why does Abraham not want Isaac to marry a Canaanite woman? Why does it have to be from his family?
- Is the servant "putting the Lord to the test" with his request of God? Or is it in the same vein as Gideon's test with the dew and the fleece? What does this "test" add to the story?
- What actions of faith of the servant do you notice? What is his attitude towards this assignment?
- Why does the story repeat the servant's interaction with God and Rebecca's passing of the "test" so many times? What can this repetition mean?
- Rebecca's brother, Laban, blesses her that she may become "thousands of ten thousands." Of what does this remind you? What does this reveal about God?
- What does it say about Isaac that he was meditating in the field? What does it say about him that he immediately went to greet Rebecca?
- Contrast Isaac at this moment (his love for Rebecca was great) with the marriages of Abram, his dad, and Jacob, his son. What about the fact that Rebecca would one day deceive him for Jacob's gain?

Action Questions:

- The Lord has blessed Abraham in everything. Abraham is among the Honor Roll of the faithful in Hebrews 11. Of course, his servant and his son walk in faith. What can we as husbands, fathers, and leaders do to ensure that those around us also walk in faith? What are possible roadblocks or pitfalls to this mission and how can we avoid them?
- Isaac left the field to go to his future wife and loved her "greatly." What do you need to "leave" in pursuit of your wife? Loving your wife greatly takes time and forethought in an incredibly busy world, what are some active ways you can pursue your wife?
