# Generosity

Proverbs 11:25; 2 Corinthians 9:7; Luke 6:38

**Definition:** the trait of being willing to give your money or time (Webster). God's Word, from many scriptures, tells us that we are to be full of grace and be the hands and feet of Jesus on earth.

## Generosity

"A generous person will prosper; whoever refreshes others will be refreshed". *Proverbs* 11:25 NIV

When you think of generosity do you immediately think.... money? When Biblically it is as much about Time, Talent, and Treasure and not just about money.

I Peter 4:10-11 says, "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To Him be the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen".

I occurred to me years ago that writing a check was easier than taking my time. I repented of that thinking, but it is easy to fall in a routine of just giving money. This is VERY important as well since we can't be in Russia or another foreign land with missionaries, who serve there, but we should and can contribute financially and it should be joyful and not exclude of gifts God has given.

If we consider I Peter 4 passage, we are ALL given a gift for the purpose of serving others as faithful stewards of His grace. This could mean any or all of the above Time, Talent, and Treasure. We are all rich with gifts to give to others in time of need. Whatever way you are sharing with others is it giving joy?

Several years ago I was reviewing the tax returns of a professional and to my shock he (a Christian) was tithing the Gross Income of his practice! Not a 10% tithe of his personal income after tax. I was taken back privately embarrassed of how I was tithing. The interesting thing he was doing this as a discipline learned at a young age and there was NO JOY. It was just the way it has always been with him. He was missing an important principle of the bible.
