Leaders Call Followers

Read Mark 1:17

"Follow Me" Jesus told them "And I will make you fish for people".

Leaders Know the Value of a Quiet Time

Read Mark 1:35

"Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, He got up, went out, and made His way to a deserted place. And He was praying there".

- In our very busy, information-overloaded world, it's often hard to find any margin for us to be "quiet and still". Do you have a consistent time and place that you shut out the world and just focus on you and God? If so, where, and how does it change you?
- If not, could you identify a time and place that you can consistently build into your schedule?
- If you were to do so, what advantage might come from it?

Great Leaders Learn to ... (Via Neal Daunhauer)

A) Power Down

Luke 14:8 – "Don't seek the high seat at the table".

Mark Moore – "Any of us who dare to call ourselves leaders had better be proficient with a basin and towel".

- Can you remember a time(s) when you were the "most important person in the room" and share any ways of "powering down" to better connect with others in the room?
- How do you give power to others?

B) Provide Safety

Matthew 20:18 – "The first will be the last, the last will be the first".

How do you make people feel?

C) Practice Empathy

2 Corinthians 12:9 - "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."

- Can you think of a recent situation that someone came to you to share life heartaches that the "me too" approach could have been effective?
- How do you share others' burdens?

Action Questions

- Of the three aforementioned Leadership examples, which speaks loudest to you? Any or all?
- Which of the three would you be willing to further embrace (and ask someone inside or outside the group to hold you accountable for?

Mark 1:17 | Jesus said to them, "Come with me. I'll make a new kind of fisherman out of you. I'll show you how to catch men and women instead of perch and bass."

Mark 1:35 | While it was still night, way before dawn, he got up and went out to a secluded spot and prayed.

Matthew 20:18 | We are on our way up to Jerusalem. When we get there, the Son of Man will be betrayed to the religious leaders and scholars. They will sentence him to death.

Luke 14:8 | "When someone invites you to dinner, don't take the place of honor. Somebody more important than you might have been invited by the host.
